A Chinese silver cylindrical tankard, 19th century, the body decorated in relief with cranes and bamboo, maker's mark of Wang Hing & Co of Hong Kong, height 10.1cm (missing handle), together with a Chinese silver miniature model of a sedan chair and bearers, length 13cm, a white metal box, decorated in relief with foliate panels and borders, length 8cm, a small box with incised mother-of-pearl inset top and a plated vesta case, decorated with dragons.

Condition Report

1107. Cylindrical tankard - missing handle and damage where upper part of handle was joined to body, otherwise the body and decoration in generally good condition. Weight 146.3g. Marked 'WH'.

Sedan chair - good condition, no significant damage or repairs. Weight 32.9g. Unmarked.

Box - good condition, no significant damage or repairs, hinge is good. Weight 107.6g. Unmarked.

Box with mother-of-pearl lid - small dent to bottom rim of base, otherwise good condition. Weight 27.2g. Unmarked.

Vesta case - generally good condition, few small dents and typical wear, hinge is good. Weight 29.3g. Unmarked and is plate.
