## LOT 1032

A Japanese musen cloisonné enamel vase, Meiji period, of shouldered tapering form, decorated with a butterfly and thistle on a pale green ground, height 15.5cm (chip/bruise to shoulder), together with a Fukagawa porcelain moon vase, Meiji period, painted with fish and irises, height 10cm (hairline to rim), another porcelain vase and a bronze vase, cast in relief with frogs, height 25cm (drilled hole near base).

## Condition Report

1032. Musen enamel vase - small bruise and hairline to shoulder and numerous hairlines to lower half of vase, otherwise colours are good and vibrant.

Fukagawa vase - good condition, minor wear to gilt.

Japanese porcelain vase - good condition, minor wear to enamels and gilt.

Metal vase - dirty and drilled holes near base and to neck where it has been changed to a lamp.
