LOT 1818

An 18th century English hanger with curved single-edged double-fullered blade, blade length 65.5cm, silver hilt, decorated with trophy of arms, hallmarked London 1777 with maker's mark probably for William Kinman, spiral carved green stained ivory grip, silvered metal lion's head pommel, with a silvered metal mounted leather scabbard, detailed 'Langford No. 50 Fleet Street' (scabbard in distressed condition). Note: William Kinman was one of the foremost makers of silver-hilted swords working in London during the latter half of the 18th century.

Estimate: £300 - £500

Condition Report

1818. There are some minor dinks to edge of blade, but otherwise blade is in fairly good order. The crossbar is misshapen to one side. Surface wear and indented surface to pommel. The scabbard is in two parts and has considerable surface peeling to lower section, however most of this material is still present.
