A Copeland & Garrett Late Spode blue printed Castle pattern tree and well meat dish, circa 1833-40, impressed and blue printed marks to base, length 48cm, together with a Rogers pearlware Elephant pattern circular sauce tureen, cover and stand and a similar Rogers oval tureen and matched cover, each with lion head finial and handles, diameter of sauce tureen 13.5cm, length of oval tureen 27cm (some minor faults).

Estimate: £120 - £180

Condition Report

1430. Tree and well - approx 4cm long x 2cm deep area of restoration to rim at 5 o'clock. Small chip to footrim. Typical light surface wear.

Sauce tureen - typical crazing to glaze with some minor staining to footrim of tureen which also has a small chip to the footrim. Minor glaze rubbing to handles. Stand with haircrack and chips to footrim and some minor blaze frits to rim edge and edge of central depression. Short hairline to rim.

Larger tureen - cover matched as ill fitting. Typical crazing with light staining. Chip to footrim. Two vertical rim haircracks restored primarily to interior. Restored chip to one underside corner of cover's rim and to area of flange opposite.
