Two Chinese Yixing stoneware teapots, probably late Qing dynasty, one of hexagonal form, sprigged in relief with bamboo and prunus branches, unmarked, height 8cm, the other of naturalistic branch form, decorated in relief with peach branches, impressed mark to base, height 6.1cm (chips to rim of cover).

Estimate: £200 - £300

### Condition Report

1153. Hexagonal Pot - tiny loss to end of prunus sprigged decoration and very minor manufacturing blemish to end of spout, otherwise in good condition with no cracks, chips or repairs.

Branch Form - 2 large chips and 2 smaller to end of cover. Tiny nick to rim edge otherwise ok.
