## LOT 2002

A William IV rosewood library table, in the manner of Gillows, the top inset with gilt-tooled red leather within a heavily reeded edge, the carved foliate frieze fitted with three drawers, raised on a pair of ornate lyre supports carved with acanthus leaves and rosettes, the scrolling bracket feet similarly decorated and united by a carved stretcher, height 73cm, length 158cm, depth 83cm.

Estimate: £2,000 - £3,000

## Condition Report

2002. The leather is quite scuffed and split in places, where the wood underneath has shifted slightly. There are some splits to the carved edge, some continuing into the crossbanded border, again a result of drying out of carcass timber.

Otherwise, the base is in fairly good order, also having some gapping to the supports and a few minor chips to edges of carving. The base has at some stage had quite a high polish but otherwise seems to be in original condition.
