A group of decorative ceramics, 20th century, including a pair of Isnik style hexagonal tiles, decorated in turquoise, green and red, length 19.5cm, a similar Palestine footed dish, a Royal Doulton green glazed circular dish and an elephant bookend (some faults).

Estimate: £50 - £80

Condition Report

1473. Palestine dish - some losses to the glaze on the rim edge and to the red painted areas revealing the pottery body beneath. Overall crazing. Otherwise ok.

Elephant - overall crazing, discolouration and dirt build up to high points, otherwise in good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

Two hexagonal tiles - both with glaze losses to the corners and general surface wear all-over and crazing.

Large square tile - larger areas of glaze losses and chips to edges predominantly, but a few to the centre as well.

Green glazed plates and dish - 2 with chips to rim, one of these also cracked. Overall crazing to all. Oval dish with minor chips to rim.

Green glazed cup - minor chips to glaze on rim.

Other pieces good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.
