A pair of English porcelain ice pails and covers, early 19th century, each cylindrical tapering body enamelled with floral bouquets and scattered sprigs beneath low relief floral moulded detail, flanked by angular handles with gilded detail and raised on four square feet with gilt enriched moulded claws, unmarked, height 28cm (some faults).

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

4176. Overall surface wear/scratches to glaze, enamels remain bright with minor wear.

First pail - finely crazed with some very light discolouration, approx 15cm long horizontal hairline to main body just above feet. A few minor manufacturing firing cracks to feet and to one handle terminal.

Second pail - finely crazed with some discolouration predominantly to base interior and around handles.

Horizontal hairline running between terminals of one handle and another between two feet on base underside.

A few manufacturing firing cracks predominantly to feet, one to rim.

First cover - finely crazed with some light discolouration to surface predominantly, a few minor vertical hairlines to side. Gilded rim a bit rubbed. Some black pitting to pooled glaze.

Second cover - some minor crazing. Handle detached but available with the lot with remnants of old pinned repair. Minor chip to flange. 3 vertical haircracks to side.
