### LOT 1429

A Barr Flight & Barr Worcester porcelain two-handled vase, circa 1815, the urn shaped body painted with a titled view of Blarney Castle, Cork, reserved within a gilded frame against a pale blue marbled ground with gilt cracked ice detail, flanked by gilded eagle handles with outstretched wings, raised on a gilded square base, puce painted marks and title to base, height 36cm (converted to a lampbase).

Estimate: £150 - £250

### Condition Report

1429. The vase is fully marked to the base. The neck rim does not have a recess so it would not originally have come with a cover. The lamp conversion has caused no exterior issues apart from the foot - which must have been removed to be drilled - is now a little loose when the lamp fittings are not attached. 1.5cm by 1cm flat chip to edge of one eagle wing. The painted panel has four noticeable vertical scratches through the castle - please see the images on our website. Otherwise is good condition. No cracks or restoration.
