A pair of Japanese ivory tusk vases and wood stands, Meiji period, each tusk section incised and stained with three flying cranes, each carved wood stand with pierced scroll apron, raised on four scroll legs united by an undertier, height 24cm.

Condition Report

1135. The ivory vases including small wood bases which are attached weigh total 419g. One ivory vase has a tiny chip to rim, otherwise in good order. Both stands in generally good order with no significant damage or repairs. One of the securing pins to stand is chipped so vase sits loose on stand.
