LOT 2133

A mid-19th century French rosewood extending dining table with five extra leaves, the moulded top raised on carved acanthus leaf and scroll supports, terminating in brass castors, height 75cm, extended length 375cm, depth 126cm.

Estimate: £200 - £400

Condition Report

2133. The table is generally in good overall condition with gapping to the veneer on both ends and a few small chips to the edges of the carved scroll feet. The pull-out system works well and the central support gives it enough strength in the middle. The central support is missing a small turned piece of wood that fits to the end supports when closed. The leaves are oak framed pine boards and would have been the originals. Even though they do not match in appearance, the custom in France would have been cheaper made leaves which would then be covered in a table cloth. There is some evidence of woodworm in areas of the understructure. There are also some of the small drop finial tips missing to the main stems.
