A collection of Chinese ceramics and works of art, late Qing dynasty and later, including a white enamelled celadon glazed bottle vase and stopper, late 19th century, decorated with dragons and clouds, height 38.5cm (repaired neck), a yellow glazed bottle vase, enamelled with peonies and tendrils, height 33cm (repaired neck), a teadust glazed vase, height 21cm, a sang-de-boeuf glazed two-handled vase, height 22cm, and two metal figures of Buddhist lions, height 15cm, together with a Japanese cloisonné jar and cover.

Condition Report

1189. Celadon vase and stopper - neck broken and repaired and repaired chip to rim of cover, otherwise good condition.

Blue glazed vase - good condition.

Teadust vase - good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs.

Yellow dragon bottle vase - good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs.

Incised yellow vase - two 'U' shaped sections broken from neck and re-glued. Crack to lower body around approximately 1/2 of footrim.

Flambe vase - drilled hole to base, otherwise good.

Celadon dog - good condition, scuffs and crazing to glaze.

Two metal dogs - verdigris markings otherwise ok.
