A large pair of Coalport porcelain two-handled vases and covers, 1860s, the U-shaped bodies each painted with a continuous mountainous riverscape view beneath a foliate moulded band, flanked by high-loop ribbed gilded and black enamelled handles, the necks with similar landscape painting beneath the domed covers with acanthus knops, raised on circular feet and square bases, unmarked, height 81cm (minor faults). Note: a similar shaped vase, catalogued as 'Exhibition Quality', was sold by Tennants Auctioneers, 17th November 2011, Lot 49.

Estimate: £300 - £500

Condition Report

1453. Both vases generally in good clean condition, no significant damage or repairs.

1st vase - the square base has numerous hairline cracks, both horizontally where it joins the circular foot and vertically across the base. There is also a hairline running horizontally around the stem. A couple of chips to the rims and minor gilding wear. The vase also sits slightly unevenly on its base.

2nd vase - couple of chips to rim edges. Typical wear to gilding, but generally in good condition.
