LOT 1442

A Continental majolica jug and cover, late 19th/early 20th century, of coopered tapering cylindrical form with naturalistic handle, the cover modelled as the head and shoulders of a dog, impressed marks to base, height 24cm, together with a similar smaller majolica jug, height 19cm (some faults).

Estimate: £250 - £350

Condition Report

1442. Large jug - overall fine crazing to glaze with minor staining to underside, some limescale to interior. 0.5cm square chip to exterior rim of spout, slightly larger chip to exterior edge of foot. Handle broken and visibly glued at upper terminal and angled section with minor losses along the break lines. Vertical hair-crack to rim of cover and 2 tiny chips.

Small jug - overall fine crazing to glaze with some staining to underside. 2 large cracks running vertically to body approx 8cm long and joining at point where they continue to one nearly to footrim. Approx 1cm square chip to rim exterior at start of one of these cracks. 2 other shorter vertical hair-cracks to body. Chipping and losses to spout with other smaller chips to rim interior and edge of foot. Cover cracked and missing section of rim with another smaller chip to rim edge.
