LOT 1135

A late 19th/early 20th century lacquered brass four glass mantel clock with eight day movement striking on a gong and mercury compensated pendulum, the backplate stamped with 'A.D. Mougin' maker's mark, the enamel chapter ring with black Roman numerals on a grey ground, the case with bevelled glass panels, on a plinth base with bracket feet, height 32.5cm, with winding key.

Estimate: £300 - £400

Condition Report

1135. Mechanism: In clean condition and running at the time of inspection and strike train operating correctly at the time of inspection, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch.

Hands and Dial: Original, undamaged, blue steel hands hands. Dial in good condition with no apparent damage.

Pendulum: Mercury pendulum intact with no damage but mercury very discoloured and glass tubes mercury stained.

Case: Brass case in sound condition although is suffering from lacquer deterioration and will require cleaning and re-lacquering to bring it back to acceptable condition. All glass panels in good condition.

Case Fault: One securing screw missing from left-hand rear case pillar. At the moment no apparent damage has occurred but this screw should be replace as soon as possible to save glass being damaged.
