A late 19th century French ormolu, champlevé and porcelain mounted clock with eight day movement striking on a gong, the backplate with stamped 'Vincenti' maker's mark, the dial with blue Roman numerals and flower festoons, the case with flame finials above bevelled glass panels within polychrome enamel borders, the front inset with porcelain panels, decorated in white relief with putti, cornucopia, cherubs and clouds on a green ground, height 39.5cm, flanked by a pair of matching vases, each ogee baluster body decorated with classical figures and cornucopia, height 34.5cm.

Condition Report

1157. Mechanism: Please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch. Reasonably clean mechanism with no parts obviously missing. The clock will run and the strike train appear to be working correctly. Although we do not feel there are any major problems, the entire mechanism would benefit from clean and re oil.

Case: the case and the garnitures are all in an undamaged condition, but the entire clock is in a somewhat dirty, dusty condition and could really do with a good clean.

Clock comes with a non original winding key.

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
