A group of Oriental ceramics, mostly 19th/20th century, including a Chinese grey crackle glazed bottle vase, height 16cm, a Chinese teadust glazed pot of squat globular form, underglaze blue pseudo four character mark of Jiaqing to base, height 5.2cm, three Yixing stoneware teaspoons, a Kutani seated cat and a streaky glazed bottle vase (some with faults).

Condition Report

1136. The enamelled Yixing teapot is in good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs. Some typical light wear and scratches to enamelled decoration and some light wear to brown finish on stoneware.

Crackle glazed vase - two chips to rim, otherwise ok.

Streaky glazed pottery vase - two chip to rim and chip to footrim.

Kutani cat - missing left hand and some wear to gilt and enamels.

White monkey - good condition, minor scuffs/wear to glaze.

Teadust pot - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

Tang style deer - badly damaged and repaired.

Larger Yixing dragon teapot - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

Small Yixing teapot - badly damaged and repaired body and cover.
