A Chinese famille rose and powder blue ground porcelain vase, mark of Kangxi but late 19th century, of baluster form, painted with opposing oval panels, one filled with a lotus pond, the other with a plump bird perched on a prunus branch, underglaze blue pseudo six-character mark to base, height 23.2cm (cracked across footrim), together with a hardwood cover and stand.

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

1232. There are four ridges cut out of the foot as you can see in our images. There is a crack which runs across the foot from one side to the other and on one side runs approx 5cm up the body. Otherwise body of vase in good condition with only typical light wear to gilt. Wood cover and stand in good order.
