LOT 1125

A group of Japanese pottery, mostly 19th century, including a Tamayama Kyoto earthenware bowl, Meiji period, painted and gilt with two maidens on a pleasure boat within complex simulated brocade borders, gilt signature to base, diameter 12cm (chip to rim), a Sobei Kinkozan shell shaped teapot, a similar small jar and cover, and three Kutani porcelain side plates (some faults).

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

1125. Bowl - chip to rim, typical light crazing, otherwise good order.

Teapot - overall good condition, no significant damage or repairs. Typical light crazing and minor wear to enamels. Lid has a small chip to rim and a crack across the top.

Pair of plates - one with chip to rim, other in good order, both with minor wear to gilt.

Single eggshell plate - hairline crack to rim.

Jar and cover - good condition, typical light crazing and some staining.

2 saucers - no chips, cracks or repairs, but both with wear to gilt. one somewhat worse than the other.

Tea bowl - small chip and hairline to rim and typical light crazing.

Pot - hairline crack, missing lid, repair to spout and staining.
