A George III silver four-piece tea set of cushion form, each engraved with scrolling and foliate bands, comprising a hot water pot, raised on a rectangular base and ball feet, a teapot, a two-handed sugar bowl and a milk jug, London 1814 by Peter & William Bateman, height of hot water pot 25.5cm.

Condition Report

404. The set is generally in fairly good condition, if a little bit tired. No apparent erasures and no personal inscriptions. Engraving is pretty good with some typical light wear and surface scratches. Would all benefit from a clean. Hallmarks are over two year with date letters 'S' and 'T' for 1813 and 1814, the teapot being 1813 and the other three pieces being 1814.

Hot water pot - few small dents to the body but no significant damage or repairs. Handle is repaired. Hinge is good.

Teapot - some small dents/wear to belly of teapot. Few minor dents to tip of spout. Hinge and handle are good.

Milk jug - numerous small dents to body and larger dent to front corner. Probably the worst condition of the four bits.

Sugar bowl - some small dents to belly of body.
