### LOT 1166

A late 19th century slate and marble inlaid mantel clock with eight day movement striking on a gong, the cream chapter ring framing a black centre, inscribed 'W. Gadsby Lincoln', the case with inlaid marble panels, on a plinth base, height 40cm, with pendulum and winding key.

### Condition Report

1166. Mechanism: standard French mechanism found in this type of clock.

The movement appears to be complete but in a very dirty condition. It would require a full overhaul to bring it back to full working order. No parts appear to be missing although the gong striking hammer needs adjustment. The clock mechanism will run for a short period but I cannot confirm that it will be reliable without a full overhaul. Original pendulum and a winding key.

Dial: chapter ring in good condition, black centre with wear from winding key. The glass front door is sound. Good set of bold brass hands.

Case: the case is in overall good condition with no major problems apart from some very minor nibbles on the edges of the slate. The base of this clock case is a wooded panel, it is not secure and some attention will be required to this fixing.
