A George III silver christening tankard with banded decoration, London 1790 by Robert Hennell I, height 6.4cm, together with a small group of other silver items, including a pair of salts with blue glass liners and a pair of sugar tongs.

### Condition Report

329. Tankard - generally good condition with only minor dents to body. Good clear marks to base.

Salt spoon - misshapen bowl.

Plated salt spoon - worn.

Tongs - good but typical light wear.

Berry spoon - good condition.

Salts - generally ok, but one has some slight damage (splits and misshaping) to piercing just below rim. Good clear hallmarks. One blue glass liner a replacement, which is also badly chipped. The original liner with star cut base has very minor rim chips.

Total weight 346g.
