A Japanese Satsuma earthenware circular bowl by Kinkozan, Meiji period, of steep-sided kiku outline, the interior centred with a scene of four scholars on a pilgrimage, one seated and painting a landscape while others prepare food and drink, the sides filled inside and out with luxuriant millefleurs, iron red and gilt four-character signature to base, height 19.5cm, diameter 31cm (faint hairline to rim).

Condition Report

1020. The chip illustrated on our website is just a very shallow chip to interior of rim with no cracks/hairlines emanating from this area. The hairline is on one of the other rim lobes and runs approx 6cm vertically down from the rim. The hairline is visible from both sides, but only really under magnification, and there is a slight line across the top of the gilt rim. There is also typical light crazing to the entire piece. Otherwise the bowl is in generally good condition with no restoration. Typical very minor wear to gilt.
