A collection of Chinese pottery teapots, late 19th century and later, including two enamelled Yixing stoneware teapots, heights 11.5cm and 7.5cm, a smaller Yixing stoneware teapot of lobed circular form with Buddhist lion finial, height 8cm, a porcelain pot and cover, painted with figural panels and black calligraphic text, height 17cm, five matching teabowls and famille rose examples (some with faults).

Condition Report

1264. Small Yixing teapot - spout broken off and re-glued and hairline crack to body. Lid has numerous chips to inner rim and outer rim.

Large enamelled teapot - hairlines to handle at top and bottom where it joins body. Otherwise body is in good condition, light typical wear to enamels. Tiny chip to rim, cover has numerous small chips to inner rim and wear to enamels.

Smaller enamelled teapot - generally good condition, minor chips to tip of spout and chips to inner rim of lid.
