A Sino-Tibetan gilt bronze figure of the four-armed Manjushri, mark of Xuande but probably late Qing dynasty, modelled seated in dhyanasana, wielding a sword, dressed in elaborate headdress, beaded jewellery, robe and celestial scarf, on a double lotus moulded base, incised sixcharacter mark to lotus base, height 24cm (sword damaged and part of blade missing).

Estimate: £8,000 - £12,000

Condition Report

1200. Small section of blade missing to the sword above the right shoulder and the top of the lotus is missing above the left shoulder. A finger is missing to upper right hand and a small section of the elaborate headdress is missing just to the left corner of the central ornament. Otherwise the figure is in good condition with typical wear to the highpoints showing the gilt beneath a slightly strange brown/black patination.
