## LOT 1270

An early 19th century mahogany bracket clock with twin fusee movement striking hours on a bell, the backplate inscribed 'Thorp, St Lukes London', the signed circular painted dial with black Roman hour numerals, the dome top case with boxwood line inlaid decoration, the sides applied with gilt metal cornucopia and loose ring handles above pierced scale fret panels, on a moulded plinth base and brass ball feet, height 41cm, with pendulum.

Estimate: £400 - £600

## Condition Report

1270. Mechanism - twin fusee, chain driven mechanism that appears to be in working order. All parts present and correct including a ladder style pendulum. Maker's signature on backplate.

Dial - repainted dial in reasonable condition with an original set of pierced moon poise hands.

Case - the mahogany case has been stripped back of all signs of polish and will require repolishing to bring it back to acceptable condition. Some cracking to the case arch.

All brass inlay intact. No keys.
