A creamware jug, probably Liverpool, circa 1790, printed in black with 'The Weavers Arms' opposing an allegorical figure of Hope leaning on an anchor, looking out to sea, unmarked, height 16.5cm (some faults), together with a Dutch decorated creamware plate, late 18th century, painted in black with Abraham sacrificing Isaac, diameter 25cm (extensively riveted).

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

1407. Jug - approx 1cm square chip to exterior tip of spout and 3 tiny nicks to footrim. Both prints quite scratched - particularly the Arms which also is a little worn in places. Some minor staining and fritting to top rim. Approx 1cm diameter manufacturers blemish to glaze surface beneath spout.

Plate - extensively broken and riveted with some spots of loss and filling.
