A rare Derby porcelain figure, late 18th century, modelled as Cupid disguised as a money lender wearing floral decorated drapery, holding aloft a bag and floral posy, standing before bocage on a circular base picked out with enamelled and gilt scrolls, height 24cm, together with a similar Derby figure of a Cupid holding a bird (repairs and restoration).

Estimate: £100 - £150

Condition Report

1416. Money Lender - both wings made up/restored. Right arm reattached at shoulder. Top of bag held in raised hand restored. Missing left index finger. 2 small chips to toes and to front edge of drapery. Restoration and losses to bocage. Gilding rubbed.

Holding Birds - both wings made up/restored. Restored through neck. Right arm glued at elbow. Bird in left hand restored. Right fingers chipped. Restoration and losses to bocage. Minor rubbing to base and gilding.
