## LOT 1418

A pair of H. & R. Daniel Shrewsbury Service dessert plates, circa 1826, each painted to the centre with the crest of the Earl of Shrewsbury with earl's coronet, within an apple green ground border reserved with floral and exotic bird panels, framed with gilded foliate scrollwork, rare puce printed marks to reverse detailed with symbols of The Union, diameter 22cm (minor faults).

## Condition Report

1418. Both heavily crazed. One with large brown stain spot around tail of central lion and smaller stain spot at 5 o'clock over gilt rim around lion, otherwise both with very minor and indistinct staining. The more heavily stained plate has four indistinct hairlines to the rim, primarily visible to the underside, and has some very minor scratches/wear to the green ground cavetto. The other plate has one haircrack to the rim at 3 o'clock and very minor scratches/wear to the green ground of the cavetto.

Both with good strong enamels and gilding overall.
