LOT 1419

A large pair of Coalport porcelain yellow ground jardinières and stands, circa 1805, of bucket shape with gilded moulded ring handles and gilt rims, each painted with a gilt framed rectangular floral panel, the yellow ground stands with gilt line detail, unmarked, overall height 18.2cm.

Note: a similar jardinière is illustrated by Michael Messenger in 'Coalport 1795-1926', p.140, pl.91.

Estimate: £400 - £600

Condition Report

1419. Both stands in good condition with no cracks, chips or restoration. Typical rubbing to gilding.

First jardiniere - approx 3cm long haircrack to base radiating from central drainage hole and with more indistinct hairline curving around it. Approx 1cm long manufacturing blemish to yellow ground on middle of back of body. Scratch to right of panel by handle, otherwise typical minor wear and rubbing to gilding with no chips or restoration.

Second jardiniere - no cracks, chips or restoration. Minor kiln adhesion to base interior. There are some horizontal scratches primarily to the yellow ground at the back of the jardiniere, otherwise typical light rubbing to gilt rim.
