A pair of Meissen porcelain bouquetière figures, late 18th/19th century, modelled after Kändler as a lady and gentleman in 18th century style floral decorated clothing, seated on floral encrusted white glazed rockwork bases, each holding an oval basket painted with scattered floral sprigs, crossed swords in underglaze blue to bases with incised numerals '1006' and '1007', height 19.5cm (some restoration).

Estimate: £600 - £800

Condition Report

1422. Male - restored break to upper part of left arm, small chip to cuff of left sleeve. Right arm restored at elbow and glued at wrist with restored thumb and glued fingers with tiny chips. Both handles of basket made up. Minor chips and losses to applied flowers and foliage on base. Indistinct re-gilt spot to front edge of base. Female - restoration to lacy brim of bonnet and small part of forehead. Right arm restored from cuff down. Small chip to left cuff of sleeve. Both handles of basket made up and associated restoration to thumbs and right fingers. Small and indistinct manufacturers chip to raised corner hem of floral apron. Minor chips and losses to applied flowers and foliage on base.
