LOT 1435

A gilt metal mounted Sèvres style cobalt blue ground vase and cover, late 19th century, the U-shaped body painted with an oval scene of Venus at Vulcan's forge, looked on by Cupid, indistinctly signed, opposing a panel of flowers and fruit, each within gilt framing joined by gilded floral garlands, raised on a gilt metal foot, the cover with acanthus finial, blue painted marks to foot, height 35cm (minor faults).

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

1435. Two curve shaped firing cracks amidst gilded foliage around base of vase above foot - there are some minor losses along these lines but they would appear to be a manufacturing issue primarily. The blue ground and gilding is a little misfired in places but nothing untoward or ugly. There is typical light wear/rubbing to the gilding, e.g., where the cover sits.
