A Doulton Lambeth stoneware gilt metal mounted table oil lamp, circa 1882, decorated by Mark V. Marshall and Emma Martin, monogrammed, the tapering body with two incised panels, one depicting the sun below cockerels, inscribed 'Matin', the other with the moon below owls, inscribed 'Nox', within foliate borders, held within gilt metal supports with scroll detail for the legs, on a cruciform base, the reservoir decorated with foliage, fitted with a Palmer & Co Duplex burner with glass chimney, impressed and incised marks, total height to top of reservoir 42.5cm.

Condition Report

1494. The main stoneware body is in good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs.

The stoneware reservoir has an approx 1.5cm square spot of professional restoration to the rim edge - only noticeable by an expert eye.

The metal mounts are overall good with very minor surface degradation, one of the top button finials is loose and possibly a replacement, the bolt holding the metal liner in place is missing.

The burner mechanism is mostly present but would need some attention.

The chimney has a minor chip to the base edge.

There is no shade.

No signs of conversion.
