### LOT 1532

Two Walton pottery pearlware figures, early 19th century, modelled as a shepherd and his dog and a musician playing a trumpet, each flanked by bocage and raised on a naturalistic base, applied 'Walton' banner mark to reverse trumpeter with 'Salter Collection' label, heights 14.5cm and 15.5cm, together with a Staffordshire figure group of a seated couple on a naturalistic base, flanked by bocage, height 26.5cm (some faults and restoration).

Estimate: £100 - £150

### Condition Report

1532. Shepherd - small area of professional restoration to front lower and upper edge of base where flowers would have been applied. Restoration also to left leg, length of crook, front right side of torso, small part of hat brim and some edges of bocage. Minor losses otherwise to bocage.

Trumpet player - the green to the base and trousers has a fair amount of flaking which has been sympathetically repainted. Typical minor losses to bocage and applied flowers.

Seated couple - missing left side of bocage with remnants of old repair, all corners of base chipped. Man missing lower right leg with chipped left fingers and hat brim. Lady missing majority of rack, repair to right wrist and chipped nose.
