An early Victorian silver castle-top card case of rectangular form with hinged lid, one side die-stamped with a scene of Newstead Abbey, the other with Warwick Castle, each within engine turned borders, Birmingham 1838 by Taylor & Perry, length 9.6cm, with a leather case (the case with faults).

### Condition Report

385. Generally good condition, both sides have good crisp images. Typical light wear and scratches to engine turning and sides, but no significant damage and no repairs. Hinge is good and cover closes tightly. Good clear mark to lid interior and slightly rubbed mark to base. It has an engraved inscription across the top, 'Agnes R. Owen 1830', and down the side panels 'Agnes Riddell Tilghman 1870' and 'Agnes Tilghman Lurman Aug 20 1904'. Leather case is distressed and missing end panels and hinge broken.
