A Chinese brown patinated bronze censer, late Qing dynasty, of squat circular form with lion mask handles, cast dragon roundel mark to base, width across handles 13.5cm (tear to one side), together with a Sino-Tibetan copper box, 19th century, the hinged lid and sides pierced and embossed with dragon, bats, lotus and scrolls, picked out in gilt, length 14.6cm, and two Chinese bronze brushpots, 20th century, one cast with Arabic script, height 8cm, the other with goats in landscape, height 12.8cm.

Condition Report

1164. Lion mask handled censer - 4cm split to one side running downwards vertically from rim. Otherwise in good condition with typical light wear and surface scratches. Weight 461.5g, rim diameter 8cm.

Box - generally good condition, no significant damage or repairs. Slight misshaping to rims and typical light surface wear and scratches. Hinge is good. Weight 317.3g.

Cylindrical censer with script - good condition, no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface wear and scratches. Weight 870.4g, diameter 9.7cm.

Brush pot - good condition, no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface wear. Weight 903.7g.
