### LOT 1039

A Chinese blue and white crackle glazed porcelain vase, late 19th century, of baluster form, painted with pavilions in a landscape within iron oxide borders, height 30cm, together with a Japanese Kutani porcelain vase, height 29cm, and a small group of Chinese and Japanese porcelain and works of art (minor faults).

### Condition Report

1039. Blue and white crackle glazed vase - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light wear and light surface scratches.

Kutani vase - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light crazing and typical light wear to gilt.

Pair cloisonné vases - good condition, no significant damage or repairs.

Cloisonné bowl - good condition, minor wear and some wear to gilt rim.

Cloisonné bowl with blue interior - numerous chips to enamel around rim and misshapen.

Enamel bowl with horses - good condition, no significant damage or repairs. Typical light wear and surface scratches.

Blue and white export decagonal plate - cracked right across and numerous rim chips.

Circular dish - three faint hairlines to rim, otherwise in good order.

Smaller cup - three hairlines to rim and rim chips.

Larger cup - is English blue and white. Hairline cracks to rim.

Wood figure - generally good order, typical light wear, but no significant damage.

Four small pieces of cloisonné - all ok, but with some typical wear and surface scratches.
