### LOT 1198

A group of South East Asian blue and white wares, 16th/17th century, including Chinese, Sukhothai and Sawankhalok, comprising a ribbed hexagonal jar, painted with flaming pearl motif, height 9.5cm, two small boxes and covers, a larger bun shaped box and cover, a jarlet and cover, five further jarlets and a small ewer (some faults).

Estimate: £150 - £250

### Condition Report

1198. Hexagonal jar - surface wear to relief edges, otherwise ok.

Taller jar and cover - restoration to inner flange where cover sits, chip here too.

Shorter jar and cover - chip to inner flange and rim edge of base.

Larger jar and cover - cover missing section of rim, small vertical crack to base with minor glaze chip to exterior rim edge.

Jarlet and cover - some vertical hairlines to glaze around shoulders and minor frit to rim.

Ewer - restored handle, neck, rim and spout. Spout chipped and small crack to rim. Lacking cover.

Three handled jar - chipping to neck rim, glaze rubbing to handles.

Four other jarlets - Biggest - filled chips to rim and repair to base. Second biggest - minor wear, otherwise ok.

Third biggest - ok. Smallest - fritting to neck rim.
