LOT 611

A mid-Victorian gold and garnet brooch, circa 1850, in an entwined looped design, mounted with oval cut garnets between floral and foliate engraved sides, fitted with pendant chains and a gold and garnet set oval pendant locket, the front mounted with two oval cut garnets within floral and foliate engraved surrounds, the back glazed with a woven hair locket compartment, brooch width 6.2cm, locket length 2.7cm (now detached from the brooch).

Condition Report

611. Brooch ♦ the front of the brooch is in good condition. The lower edge of the front is pierced in four places, however the two pendant chains don♦ correspond to these four positions. The original drops/drop which would have been attached by chains is now detached and has a loop at the top fitted with two lengths of chain which originally would have been part of the bottom section of the brooch. The floral and foliate engraved decoration to both pieces matches although the pendant locket is darker than the brooch.
