An early 19th century ebonized bracket clock, the eight day chain driven twin fusee movement with verge escapement striking hours on a single bell, the finely engraved backplate incorporating the Prince of Wales feathers, the repainted break arch dial with strike/silent indicator to arch, above black Roman hour numerals and outer Arabic quarters and inscribed 'George Carruthers London', the case with single pad top and brass carry handle above a moulded arch pediment, glazed doors and sides, on a rectangular plinth base, height 47cm, with key (pull repeat lever missing).

Condition Report

1153. Generally good condition with a poorly re-painted dial, but no significant damage. Re-ebonized case with some cracks to veneer. Lock missing to front door. Modern replacement hands. Movement in generally good clean order and appears to be in working order but the pull repeat lever is missing.
