A small group of Oriental metalware, 19th century and later, including a pair of Japanese brown patinated bronze vases, Meiji period, each shouldered body cast in relief with sparrows flying amidst chrysanthemums, height 18cm, a Chinese polished bronze censer of lobed oval form with lotus stand, diameter 12cm, and an Indian bronze handle with Nandi bull finial, length 10cm.

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

1039. Pair vases - base of one has been pushed through and is misshapen with noticeable dent to body on front side. Both vases have overall surface wear, differences in the patination and some encrustations due to oxidisation.

Single vase - footrim a bit dented and hence misshapen. Small dent to widest part of main body. Varying colours overall to surface patination.

Censer - small dent to body on one side, surface scratch to top rim edge.

Pair tortoises - some minor verdigris, otherwise ok.

Finial - two solder repairs to stem, slight unevenness to base edge rim above screw fitting.
