A Chinese famille verte porcelain vase, Kangxi period, of mallet form, the body painted with a lakeside pavilion, rocks, trees and boats with islet beyond, opposing a black line framed panel of nine lines of black text and two red seals, the shoulder with band of iron red prunus and cracked ice beneath black bamboo to neck, height 21.5cm, with wood stand, together with a Chinese famille verte porcelain teapot, Kangxi period, height 9.5cm (repaired and lacking cover).

Estimate: £800 - £1,200

Condition Report

1122. Vase - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear to enamels, but nothing too significant. Slight black speck 'spit-out' to glaze on rim, but of little significance.

Teapot - missing lid. Spout has been broken off and repaired. Handle also broken into 3 pieces and re-glued. Body broken into numerous pieces and repaired with some minor losses along break lines which have been filled.
