LOT 1115

A Chinese pale celadon jade lotus and vase ornament, early 20th century, carved in high relief with three bold lotus flowers, stems and pad framing a raised rectangular vase on rocky pedestal, the stone of polished pale green tone, height 22.2cm, mounted as a table lamp, on a carved hardwood base.

Estimate: £200 - £300

Condition Report

1115. Generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Nice uniform colour tone to the stone with a few visible internal line inclusions and some very minor chips/nicks to tips of flowers and leaves, but nothing of any real significance. Stand has some wear to edges/highpoints, but no real damage.

Height of jade only 21.8cm.

Please note the base of the vase has not been drilled fully to mount it as a table lamp. We have now dismantled the base which shows the nuts to the base hold two metal supports which hold the jade in place. As you can see in the extra images taken, there is a small drill hole to the base but only a few mm deep and not used to secure the ornament. The ornament does not stand on its own accord so would suggest it is originally a piece from a larger group (?).
