A Chinese hardwood two-tier centre table, late 19th century/early 20th century, the rectangular top inset with a rouge marble panel with a carved gadrooned border, the frieze carved in low relief with lotus and scrolling leafy tendrils, the apron carved and pierced with further lotus within archaic scroll borders, raised on Buddhist lion mask and foliate shouldered legs, united by an undertier, on claw and ball feet, height 81cm, length 86cm, depth 67.5cm.

Condition Report

1165. Nice quality and well proportioned table. Generally in good condition with no significant damage. Rouge marble panel in good order with only typical light surface scratches. Good quality crisp carving to borders and friezes. Table is slightly wobbly as there is some slight gapping to joints which would need re-gluing. All side friezes in good order with no losses, only typical light scuffs and very minor nicks/chips but nothing obviously noticeable. One of the pierced scroll link side aprons under the undertier has had a small re-glued repair. Legs in good sound condition.
