LOT 1246

A small group of Chinese porcelain, Kangxi period and later, comprising a blanc-de-Chine libation cup, moulded with magnolia and prunus, height 6cm, a blue and white export teapot and cover with silver spout, height 13.5cm, a blue and white export porcelain plate, painted with precious objects, and a blue and white salad bowl, height 12cm (faults).

Estimate: £50 - £80

Condition Report

1246. Libation cup - two chips to rim and 2.5cm hairline to rim, small hairline to edge to stem base, otherwise typical light surface scratches and wear.

Plate - two-piece 'U' shaped section of rim broken off and badly re-glued. It was formerly rivet repaired (9cm long x 3cm deep), otherwise rest of the plate is in generally good order with no other cracks or repairs. Couple of tiny chips.

Teapot - cover broken into 3 pieces and re-glued, handle heavily restored and silver replacement spout. Otherwise body is ok, couple of small nicks to footrim.

Bowl - 13cm hairline to rim, 1.5cm x 2cm shallow flake chip to outside of rim near one corner. Otherwise typical light surface scratches and wear.
