LOT 1012

A pair of Chinese blue and white porcelain plates, Kangxi period, each centre painted with two seated maidens and two dancing boys within a fenced garden, within a moulded segmented border of flowers and landscapes, diameter 21.6cm, together with another Chinese blue and white plate, Kangxi period, painted with two seated figures and an attendant boy within a rim of four figural panels, diameter 23.1cm (hairline crack and minor chips to rim).

Estimate: £100 - £200

Condition Report

1012. 1st of pair - stained 17cm long haircrack running around approx one third of well of plate, which has other minor branches running from it and an unsprung chip halfway along its length. Typical minor fritted chipping to rim.

2nd of pair - Two 3cm haircracks to rim at 5 and 6 o'clock, one with narrow slice chip along length to rim underside. Extensive fritted chipping to rim circumference.

Other plate - 5.5cm long haircrack to rim at 3 o'clock. Quite a few small chips, nicks and fritting to circumference of rim.
