LOT 1023

A Chinese 'clobbered' blue and white porcelain diminutive vase, Kangxi period and later, the lobed pear shaped body with stepped circular foot and cup shaped bladed neck, painted in underglaze blue with four figural panels flanked by flowering urns, later embellished with iron red, green and gilt decoration, underglaze blue painted mark to base, height 11.3cm (some glaze fritting), together with a Chinese miniature blue and white porcelain bottle vase, Qianlong period, painted with chrysanthemums, height 6cm (chip to rim), and a wood stand.

Condition Report

1023. Clobbered vase - extensive fritting to bladed sections of vase above foot and beneath cup shaped neck, similar less so to top rim edge of cup shaped neck. The top rim edge also has a small chip which has been gilded over in an effort to disguise it. Otherwise no real damage. The later gilding is rubbed/worn.

Blue and white vase - 0.5cm square flat chip to neck rim exterior, the circumference of which is nibbled. Minor fritting to footrim. Extensive surface scratches overall.
