A group of Chinese export porcelain, Kangxi period and later, including a pair of blue and white Batavian ware small dishes, Kangxi period, each painted with a flower spray, diameter 13.4cm (minor rim repairs), seven various blue and white saucers, Kangxi period, painted with floral and landscape designs, and three pieces of Chinese Imari porcelain (some faults).

Estimate: £120 - £180

Condition Report

1236. Small bowl 1 - three hairlines to rim.

Small bowl 2 - two hairlines to rim.

Large blue and white bowl - two hairline to rim, another to base.

Other large bowl - approx one third section of bowl restored.

Plate - hairline to rim, couple of chips to rim.

Batavian dishes - both with overpainting to rim chips on underside edge.

Saucer dish with brown rim - two small re-touched areas to rim, star crack to base.

Chrysanthemum dish - haircrack to rim with associated repainting, fritting to rim with another spot of repainting.

Segmented dish - faint hairline to rim.

Lobed saucer - star crack to base, chip and haircrack to rim, extensively fritted.

Scalloped edge dish - very minor fritting.

Floral centered dish - ok.

Saucer with well - fritted chipping to well, otherwise ok.
