A Chinese blue and white porcelain soup plate, Yongzheng period, the well painted with a sword-wielding warrior and two maidens as a further figure watches from a pavilion window, diameter 21.8cm (rim repaired), together with five other Chinese blue and white plates, Kangxi period, painted with various designs of flowers, birds and flower baskets, diameters ranging from 21cm to 23cm (some faults).

Estimate: £100 - £200

Condition Report

1234. Soup plate - approx 7cm section of rim broken in two and re-glued. Small chip to rim, typical rim fritting.

Phoenix plate 1 - large section of the rim repaired, three hairlines and small chip to rim.

Phoenix plate 2 - hairline to rim.

Basket plate - a number of chips to rim, otherwise ok.

Floral plate - tiny chip to rim, minor glaze hairline to underside of base.

Garden scene plate - hairline crack to base and to rim, a few chips to underside edge of rim.
