A George V silver six-division toast rack, Sheffield 1912 by James Dixon & Sons, length 11.2cm, together with a small group of other silver items, including a four-division toast rack and a christening cup.

Estimate: £100 - £150

Condition Report

409. Six-division toast rack - generally good condition, typical light surface scratches but no significant damage or repair. Very slight misshaping to divisions but nothing significant. Good clear hallmarks. Weight 142.4g.

Four-division toast rack - good condition, typical light wear and surface scratches but no damage or repairs. Good clear hallmarks, weight 106.9g.

Mug - numerous small dents to body and handle a bit worn. Dent to foot. Slightly misshapen rim. Good clear hallmarks. Weight 152.8g.

Two napkin rings - one in good order, other is slightly misshapen, both with typical light wear and scratches. Total weight 28.5g.

Sifter spoon - slightly misshapen bowl, otherwise ok. Good clear hallmarks. Weight 30.5g.
